

Dr. Hoskins founded Southeastern Retina Associates in 1980. His patients benefit from his wide-ranging educational experience in many locales in the U.S. He began his superior career preparation as an undergraduate at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville, and then graduated from Vanderbilt University in Nashville in 1966.
